Katarzyna Lidia Babulewicz—a graduate of musicology and Polish Studies at the Jagiellonian University. She prepares her PhD on the topic of music in the animated movies produced in USRR under the guidance of dr hab. Magdalena Dziadek. She has published in, among others, "Kwartalnik Młodych Muzykologów UJ", "Edukacja Muzyczna", "Aspekty Muzyki" and "Musicologici Olomucensii".

Michał Bruliński—he has graduated from piano in the class of Prof. Ewa Pobłocka at UMFC and from history and Collegium Artes Liberales at the University of Warsaw, where currently he works on his PhD as a student at the Environmental Interdisciplinary Doctoral Studies. His texts have been published by, among others, the Institute of National Remembrance, the Chopin University Press and journals "Kronos", "Opcje" and "Ruch Muzyczny".
