"SQUARES" - A REVISION ACTIVITY

1. Introduction

In the process of learning a student works more willingly with another student than with a group (Aronson, Wilson, Akert 1997). They feel less restricted and behave more spontaneously. Due to that, various games and pair-work activities are used to optimise the process of foreign language learning and such is the function of the activity described below. The above-mentioned types of interaction make the participants more active because of both cognitive and emotional involvement. In order to achieve the expected results, it is advisable to use the techniques which will make the interaction possible. Experts in the field such as Tony Buzan, Edward de Bono, Gordon Dryden and Jeannette Vos stress the didactic value of such exercises (cf. Buzan 1996; de Bono 1999; Dryden and Vos 2000).

2. Purpose of the activity

The type of the activity I present can be used with students of all levels of advancement when revising a portion of material.

The activity has got two aims. Firstly, it is to help revise a portion of the material covered in the classroom. It can be conducted to check the understanding of a piece of grammar (reported speech, passive voice, tenses), or knowledge of vocabulary (proverbs, idioms, phrasal verbs, thematic vocabulary). Secondly, it is to make students actively involved in the process of checking what they have learnt

To illustrate my point with an example, you will find attached photocopiable sheets for C1 students, which can be used when revising the passive voice.

The source of my inspiration was the book *Gry wakacyjne* (1996). All the sentences used in the photocopiable material are from *Time*.

3. Presentation of the activity

The activity requires approximately 15 minutes and is to be conducted in pairs. If it is done at the beginning of the lesson it may also function as a "warm-up" exercise, especially for more advanced students, who should have already been familiar with a given grammatical issue.

3.1. Preparatory stage

For each student you have to prepare three grids, each divided into 16 squares. The first grid contains questions, the second one correct answers, and the third one shows wrong answers (see sheets 1A, 2A, 3A). The answers (sheets 2A & 3A) should be written in such a way that they are a mirror image of the sheet with the questions (sheet 1A). When you have done that, turn sheets 2A, 3A over and mark the squares 1-16 on copy 2A; the squares on handout 3A should be marked with the letters A-P. Then cut the answers 2A and 3A; sheet 1A remains uncut.

In the same way, prepare a set of three grids for student B.

3.2. How to conduct the activity

Students A and B get their sets. Each of them keeps the sheet with questions (1A or 1B respectively) and gives the other person the cut grids. Student B gets 2A and 3A; student A, 2B and 3B. *You have to tell them that they mustn't turn the squares over.* Student A then chooses one of the questions in 1A at random and student B looks for the answer on the squares that they have got. When they think they know the answer, they give the square with the answer to student A, who puts it in the appropriate place on his grid with the questions. Then they swap roles.

When they have completed the task, Student A checks the answers for B and vice-versa.

3.3. How to check the exercise

Students A and B turn the little squares over. If the activity has been done correctly, the numbers on the other side of the little squares will be 1-16 only.

Alternatively, instead of writing numbers and letters you can glue pictures cut from a magazine onto copies 2A, 3A (2B, 3B). When the students check the answers, they will see a picture if they have done the exercise correctly.

4. Conclusions

Having conducted the activity with my C1 groups I noticed that both of the goals mentioned in point 2 were reached. The students were involved in classwork and, moreover, the exercise made students feel responsible for what they were learning

because it was not the teacher who was correcting the mistakes but the learners themselves. The students really enjoyed the satisfaction of being able to detect mistakes and then find correct answers.

The above-mentioned observation makes me conclude that personal responsibility for the knowledge one gains is of invaluable importance in the process of foreign language learning.
